

The Office of Cultural Diversity promotes dialogue, cultural awareness, and understanding among ethnic and cultural communities, fostering the growth of our faith communities. Our goal is to cultivate a spirit of welcoming and belonging among all Catholics.

We provide resources and services to Diocesan offices, ministry leaders, parish personnel, and partner agencies in the field of multicultural ministry within the Diocese of Dallas.

This year, the Diocese hosted several events, including the St. Luke Productions Presents "Tolton: From Slave to Priest" as well as the inaugural Diocese of Dallas Multicultural Celebration, "Unity in Diversity," a celebration of the richness of the Diocese's diverse cultures.

Every Marriage

The Office of Evangelization, Catechesis & Family Life provides ongoing formation and support for parish catechetical leaders and parish family life leaders. Last year, we engaged 176 parish ministry leaders in 11 deanery meetings, offering them fellowship and formation on mental health issues. We organized celebratory events such as the Golden Anniversary Mass, honoring 95 couples from 41 parishes for their faithful love and commitment. Similarly, the Newlywed Mass provided an opportunity to accompany, celebrate, and provide resources for 180 couples in their first crucial year of marriage.

We facilitated spiritual growth and development through two retreats attended by 59 leaders from 27 parishes. In the realm of sacramental formation, we conducted three Confirmation training sessions (one in English and two in Spanish), training 184 catechists in evangelizing catechesis. We supported parishes in forming 73 engaged couples and 76 convalidating couples to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony. Additionally, 114 sponsor couples were trained to better accompany these couples through the marriage preparation process in parishes throughout the Diocese. Lastly, our ministry conference drew 290 participants from 15 parishes, who attended enriching sessions covering family life, catechesis, liturgy, and safe environment.

Every Invite: The 635



The 635 is an event for all young adults, regardless of background, to gather, pray, and learn about the Catholic faith as one community. The goal is to connect these young adults with various communities that serve them throughout the Diocese of Dallas within our parishes. Typically, this event is hosted in venues outside the parish throughout North Texas that appeal to young adults. It was first established at the Granada Theater, with a happy hour at the Sundown, but has since expanded to multiple venues. At *The 635*, attendees can expect opportunities for community building, prayer through music, and keynote addresses from national Catholic speakers.

Over the last year, we have witnessed significant growth in young adult ministry throughout the Diocese. *The 635* event in May 2024 was the largest yet, with almost 500 young adults in attendance. *The 635* serves to highlight our young adult and Pastoral Juvenil Hispana communities, as these ministries are central to its mission. Additionally, *The 635* showcases the diversity of young adults from across the Diocese of Dallas, both spiritually and culturally. These events attract members from all our parishes, whether they are actively involved in their parish community or seeking deeper connections. *The 635* has created an environment where any young adult can connect with others who are also looking to deepen their faith.

Every Formation

"My name is Ray Simpson. My wife Heidi and I have been married for 39 years, blessed with seven children and 16 grandchildren, so far. I am privileged and honored to be in formation for the permanent diaconate in the Diocese of Dallas. "My name is Deacon Bryce Baumann. I was ordained a transitional deacon by Bishop Burns on March 9, 2024, at the National Shrine Cathedral of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I attended Plano Senior High School and entered seminary immediately upon graduation. I loved being involved at my home parish of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton where my father has worked in ministry for over 20 years. While I had sensed a call to do something in ministry, it was not until I completed a process called Marian Consecration that I had a deep peace and interest to discern the priesthood. I saw the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe everywhere during that time-in churches, in businesses, and even in Tex-Mex restaurants! She helped me to see how Jesus was inviting me to use my gifts to minister to His people as a priest, and since then, my desire to love and serve the Lord in this capacity has only grown.

I keep my benefactors in my daily prayers, knowing that I truly could not be where I am without them. COMMUNITY OUTREACH



Every Mission

Through the Office of Catholic Social Ministries, in the summer of 2024, a group of 48 Catholic high school students from Bishop Dunne Catholic School, Cistercian Preparatory School, John Paul II High School, and Ursuline Academy, accompanied by 12 chaperones, two nurses, and three Diocesan staff members, traveled on a service-mission to the Diocese of San Isidro, Costa Rica.

During the seven-day mission trip in the Pejibaye District and Casa Nazareth Retreat House in San Isidro, all students and chaperones participated in four construction projects. At Casa Nazareth, the team was responsible for building a drainage system and planting trees. In the Pejibaye District, all participants contributed to the construction of a new classroom in the Guadalupe Community, building sidewalks and assisting with the construction of a new fence in the Santa Cecilia Community, and supporting the Our Lady of Lourdes Parish community in the construction of sidewalks around the church and its property.

"You get so caught up in Dallas with technology and social media and certain aspects of life; when you come down to Costa Rica, everything slows down. When you don't have technology, you reflect on what you truly have and what you truly need. It's like a cleanser throughout the year; it really helps you reflect on what you need, what you want, and really look back on your life in Dallas, and ultimately live better. "

FEBRUARY 2021 Bishop Burns calls for our diocesan Synod to start the pre-preparatory phase

- AUGUST 2021 The Preparatory Commission is formed
- **DECEMBER 2021** The opening Mass for the preparatory phase of the Synod is held at St. Ann's in Coppell with a family festival
- FEBRUARY 2022 Our first formal listening session is held the first of 30
- **NOVEMBER 2023** The final listening session is held the last of 30
- **DECEMBER 2023** The Synod assembly phase begins, acutely beginning preparations for the four-day Synod assembly that will be held in December 2024

The writing of resolutions will be completed

- **SEPTEMBER 2024** Delegates are commissioned at a Delegate Commissioning Mass, given time to prepare spiritually for the assembly
 - **OCTOBER 2024** The Implementation Commission will be formed

DECEMBER 2024 The Synod Assembly will be held December 1st – December 4th
